CanSkate News

A fantastic start to the Winter session of CanSkate, Pre-CanSkate and PowerSkate! We saw increased numbers in several of our classes as many skaters decided to continue on from the fall and new skaters registered. Unlike other programs where you are placed in a certain level and stay there for the entire term, CanSkate focuses on skill acquisition. If a skater masters certain skills, they simply move on to the next skill rather than have to wait for a new session to begin. This also means that it is easy for skaters to jump in after the session has started or to add an additional day of skating.

Learning to skate can happen at any age! We have several older children registered in our CanSkate program this session and even some adults. The structure of the program allows skaters to work on skills at their level and show that it's never too late to pick up this great winter activity!
